Pre-Writing Activities


- Practice drawing a person: Youtube Mat Man
 - Head, eyes, nose, mouth, ears, body, arms, hands, legs, & feet
- Practice tracing lines and shapes
- Practice tracing name
 - Light colored marker, sand, shaving cream, rice, salt, sprinkles, crushed cheerios, or pudding
- Place small items on a line
 - Buttons, stickers, cheerios
- Drive a toy car on a line
- Notice letters everywhere and point them out: menus at restaurants, ads on TV, labels on food, road signs, fast food signs, decorations in the house, tags on clothes, labels in shoes, mail, anywhere and everywhere!





PRE-WRITING SHAPES Children should be able to form these 9

pre-writing strokes before asking them to write.



Name Recognition Activities

- Label all of their things around the house with their name
- Write the letters of their name on clothespins and have them match the letters
- Write their name on a piece of paper and cut it out to create puzzle with one letter on each piece
- Write out the names of every family member and have them name everyone
- Write each letter of their name on a paper plate and have them hop on each letter naming them
- Help them make the letters of their name using Play-doh
- Write each letter of their name on a Post-it note and have them match each letter on a piece of paper
- Put the magnetic letters of their name on the fridge and scramble them up so every time they walk by they have to put it back together










Counting Activities





• Have them point and count each piece of their snack before eating

• Point out the labeled aisles at the grocery store, numbers on the radio stations, TV volume numbers, numbers on the clocks, numbers on the microwave, ect.

• Count how many times they can bounce a ball, hop on one foot, or do jumping jacks


• Have them count each block as they stack them

Sing counting songs like 5 Green and Speckled Frogs, The Ants Go Marching, Monkeys Jumping on the Bed, and 1, 2, 3,
4, 5 Once I Caught a Fish Alive

• Count the dots on dice and do an activity that many times

• Write a number in the bottom of a cupcake liner and have them place that many small objects into each liner

- Play card games like Uno and Go Fish
- Place the correct amount of clothespins on to each Uno card







Fine Motor Activities

- Practice getting themselves dressed buttoning, zipping, snapping, buckling, and fastening
- Lace beads onto a pipe cleaner
- Place a wooden skewers into Play-doh then sort Fruit Loops by color onto skewers
- Tear paper into pieces
- Properly use eating utensils
- Practice coloring and writing using tripod grasp
- Paint with Q-tips
- Use a clothespin to transfer cotton balls from one spot to another
- Practice cutting with scissors
 - Cut on a line, cut junk mail, cut Play-doh, cut straws
