Motion carried 6-0.

XII. RECONVENE INTO OPEN SESSION AND TAKE ANY NECESSARY PUBLIC ACTION Motion by Meissner, seconded by Deschane to reconvene into open session and take any necessary public action at 8:48 p.m. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Dama, seconded by W Cherry to give the administrative non-represented staff a raise of between 3.0 and 3.8%. Dr. Cavanaugh will receive \$50 more per day and \$200.00 a month living expenses. Pat Mans will get the raises as previously discussed which will accommodate him for taking over as Superintendent on January 21st or 22nd at the end of the semester when Dr. Cavanaugh vacates the position of Superintendent. Motion carried 5-2-0 with Wiedemeier voting no.

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Motion by Deschane, seconded by Meissner to rescind the previous motion. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Dama, seconded by W Cherry to approve Pat Mans as the new administrator at the agreed upon salary, waive the residency requirement, forgo the annuity. He will be our new administrator when Dr. Cavanaugh vacates the position on January 21st or 22nd whichever is the end of the semester. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Dama, seconded by W Cherry to give Dr. Cavanaugh \$50.00 a day m ore and increase his living expenses \$200.00 a month and he stay on as administrator as needed on a consulting basis until Pat Mans will no longer require his services. Motion carried 6-0.

Motion by Deschane, seconded by W Cherry to give the non-represented administrative contracts a raise of between 3% and 3.8% depending on the position. Motion carried 5-1-0 with Wiedemeier voting no.

XIII. ADJOURNMENT Motion by Dama, seconded by Deschane to adjourn at 9:12 p.m. Motion carried 6-0.
